The Madison Metropolitan Sewerage District (MMSD) requests a bid for the work associated with Oil Recycling and Waste Services 2025-2027. Bids will be accepted at the office of the District, 1610 Moorland Road, Madison, WI, 53713, until 11:00 am CST on Wednesday, December 18, 2024. The term of this contract will be in effect for a three-year period beginning on or around January 1, 2025, and terminating on December 31, 2027.

Qualifications

All bidders must be qualified for this specific work. Before proposals will be accepted for the work contemplated herein, MMSD may conduct such investigation as is necessary to determine the performance record and ability of the Bidders to perform the work specified in the Bidding Documents.

Scope of Work

Contractor agrees to supply all containers and equipment to remove recycled oil and associated waste at designated durations from the Nine Springs Treatment Plant at 1610 Moorland Road, Madison, WI, 53713.

Contractor shall follow State of Wisconsin guidelines pertaining to the disposal of these waste materials as outlined in 2009 Wisconsin Act 86.

Equipment and Service Specifications

- 1. Shop 2 parts washer: Clean and refill with 15 gallons of solvent every 16 Weeks.
- 2. Maintenance Facility parts washer: Clean and refill with 20 gallons of solvent every 8 Weeks
- 3. Metrogro parts washer: Clean and refill with 15 gallons of solvent every 16 Weeks.
- 4. Disposal of sorbent materials: Estimated at fifty (50) 55-gallon drums per year.
- 5. Recycling of crushed waste oil filters: Estimated at two (2) 55-gallon drums per year.
- 6. Recycling of used oil dri/absorbent (kitty litter): Estimated at two (2) 55-gallon drums per year.
- 7. Disposal of waste oil: Estimated at 2,500 gallons per year. Oil must be pumped from bulk containers located at multiple locations.

Contractor's Insurance

The Contractor shall not commence work under this Contract until all insurance required hereunder has been obtained and such insurance certification has been reviewed by the Owner. The Contractor shall not allow any Subcontractor to commence work on his

Subcontract until certification for all similar insurance required for that portion of the Work has been reviewed by the Owner. Review of the insurance certification by the Owner shall not relieve or decrease the liability of the Contractor hereunder. The insurance certification shall name as Additional Insureds the Madison Metropolitan Sewerage District.

The Contractor shall obtain, pay for, and maintain during the life of this Contract such Worker's Compensation and Employer's Liability, Comprehensive General Liability, Business Automobile Liability, and Umbrella Liability Insurance to protect the Contractor performing work covered by this Contract from claims for damages for bodily injury, including accidental death, as well as for claims for property damage which may arise from operations under this Contract whether such operations be by himself or any Subcontractor, or by anyone directly or indirectly employed by either of them, on the forms, and with limits not less than set forth below:

a) General Liability

- Comprehensive general liability coverage shall include, but not be limited to, Products and Completed Operations, Independent Contractors, Contractual Liability, Broad Form Property Damage, Personal Injury, Premises and Operations, and Explosion, Collapse and Underground.
- General aggregate limit shall be at least \$2,000,000. Policy shall be endorsed such that this full limit is reserved specifically for the named Madison Metropolitan Sewerage District project.
- Products-Completed Operations Aggregate limit shall be at least \$2,000,000.
- Each Occurrence limit shall be at least \$1,000,000.

b) Automobile Liability

- Auto liability policy shall cover all autos, whether owned, non-owned, or hired.
- Bodily injury and property damage limits shall be at least \$1,000,000 each, or
- Combined single limit shall be at least \$1,000,000.
- c) Excess Liability Umbrella Form

• Umbrella limits shall be at least \$2,000,000 aggregate/\$2,000,000 each occurrence. d) Worker's Compensation and Employer's Liability

- Worker's Compensation limits shall be in accordance with all applicable state and federal statutes.
- Employer's Liability limits shall be at least \$100,000 each accident, \$500,000 disease policy limit, and \$100,000 disease-each employee.

Equal Employment Opportunity Requirements

In connection with the performance of work for this project and under the related contract, the Proposer agrees not to discriminate against any employee or applicant for employment because of age, race, religion, color, disability, sex, national origin, sexual orientation, gender identity, or other status protected by law. This provision shall include, but not be limited to, the following: employment, upgrading, demotion or transfer; recruitment or recruitment advertising; layoff or termination; rates of pay or other forms of compensation; and selection for training, including apprenticeship.

Bid Requirements

All bids shall be submitted on the forms provided herein and shall be addressed to the Madison Metropolitan Sewerage District, 1610 Moorland Road, Madison, Wisconsin 53713, Attn: Mr. Erik Rehr, and shall be marked "Oil Recycling and Waste Services 2025-2027". Bid form can also be submitted as an email attachment.

Bids shall include a list of recyclable materials accepted in each type of container.

Bids shall include all labor, materials, equipment, tools, containers, upkeep of containers, utilities, permits/fees and all other services or items necessary to perform and complete the work in a professional manner.

Bids shall include any set up or removal fees and rental fees.

Bid prices must be firm and include all transportation, delivery, pumping and insurance costs and any other costs associated with this service.

MMSD does not guarantee it will purchase the estimated quantities. The actual may be more or less depending on actual usage of sorbent, oil dri, and filters. Bids that require a minimum annual expenditure will be rejected.

Basis of Award

Bid will be awarded on lowest total contract price for the three-year term.

<u>Terms</u>

The District reserves the right to reject any or all proposals or to waive any irregularities in any proposal or to accept any proposal which will be in the best interests of the District.

Within twenty (20) calendar days after the opening of bids, the Owner will accept one of the bids or will act as stated herein. The acceptance of the bid will be by written Notice of Award, mailed or delivered to the office designated in the bid.

Before award of any Contract can be approved, MMSD shall be satisfied that the bidder involved maintains a permanent place of business, has adequate plant and equipment to do the work properly and expeditiously, has a suitable financial status to meet obligations incident to the work, has appropriate technical experience, and has a satisfactory performance record. The award, if made, will be made to the lowest, qualified, responsive, responsible bidder.

Contract letting is subject to the provisions of Section 66.0901, Wisconsin Statutes.

Contract Cancellation

This Contract may be terminated by either party under the following conditions:

- 1. MMSD may terminate the contract at any time at its sole discretion by delivering 30days written notice to the Contractor.
- If the problem is service performance, Contractor will be warned either verbally or in writing of unsatisfactory performance and intent to cancel this contract. Contractor will be given a period of time to 'cure' the performance. If the performance does not improve, Contractor will be given 30- days written notice that the contract will be cancelled.
- 3. In the event the Contractor terminates the contract, for any reason whatsoever, it will require written certified letter notification delivered to the MMSD Procurement Agent not less than 120-days prior to said termination.
